On March 14, 2018 at 1:00 PM, the Fraser Historical Society will be holding our first event of this year at the Depot located on Masonic and Kelly Rd in Fraser, featuring Marybeth Novitsky

"My name is Marybeth Novitsky. I have been in the medical field for over 20 years. I have marketed pharmaceuticals, medical equipment for Ear Nose and Throat physicians, and also worked in Skilled Nursing Facilities. I now represent Bemer. My daughter was playing professional basketball in Spain, and injured her knee. She was given Bemer session to help her heal. This got my attention.

Bemer is a microcirculation device from Germany and has been used in Europe for 20 years. We have had Bemer in Michigan for only 2 years. It's a Pulsed Electric Magnetic Field device that carries a signal which increases bloodflow. This blood carries oxygen to the capillaries and helps the body heal itself. It takes 8 minutes, two times a day, to achieve the maximum benefit. These would include increased energy, nutrients and oxygen delivered, and waste disposal, increased cardiac function, increased physical fitness, strength and energy, concentration, mental acuity, stress reduction, and relaxation. There is also a sleep management program.

The following Pumpkin Cake recipe was served at our January Volunteer's Thank You Luncheon and many people have asked for the recipe.



Marilynn's Pumpkin Cake

Cake: 1 box Yellow Cake Mix (reserve 1 cup for topping)

½ cup margarine

1 egg

Filling: 1 large can Pumpkin Pie Filling 29 oz. or 30 oz.

2 eggs

2/3 cup evaporated milk

Topping: 1 cup (reserved) cake mix

¼ cup sugar

1 tablespoon cinnamon

¼ cup softened margarine

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease bottom of a 9X13 inch pan.

In a large bowl beat together the dry cake mix, melted margarine and eggs until well blended. Pour batter into bottom of baking pan.

Mix pumpkin pie filling, eggs and milk by hand until the mixture is smooth and well blended. Spread filling over the cake batter.

In a small bowl mix together reserved dry cake mix, sugar, cinnamon and margarine. Sprinkle over the top of filling.

Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes or until a knife inserted in center comes out clean.



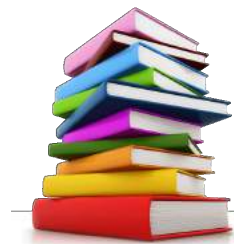
Save the Date. Our Spring Flea Market will be held on Sunday June 10th.
